### **Terms and Conditions:**

#### Registration

All presenters must register and pay the applicable <u>conference fee</u>. For each approved concurrent session, up to 2 presenters will be granted a \$50 discount off the conference registration fee. The reminder to check the presentation portal for your presenter discount code was sent to the contact person on June 13<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Submitting your slides**

Presentation slides (with your completed COI slides, see 'Declaration of Conflict of Interest')
must be submitted two weeks before the conference, September 5<sup>th</sup>, 2019. You will receive a
follow-up email reminding you of this deadline and to confirm the number of participants
registered for your presentation.

### **Declaration of Conflict of Interest**

- We are currently seeking accreditation for continuing professional education for physicians, and Canadian health executives. Your presentation qualifies as learning time in our application. As a result, all presenters must declare any potential conflicts of interest during their presentation and to conference organizers in order to fulfil the College of Family Physicians of Canada and the Ontario Chapter's requirements.
- To meet these requirements please include the following and upload to your presentation management portal by June 27<sup>th</sup>, 2019.
  - o The CFPC MAINPRO® Declaration of Conflict of Interest Form
    - All presenters, <u>contributors AND authors</u> are to submit one form each.
  - o The CFPC MAINPRO® Declaration of Conflict of Interest Slides
    - All presenters <u>ONLY</u> are to submit one set of slides each.
    - If <u>no</u> disclosures of any direct financial or in-kind interest in a for-profit or notfor-profit entity are declared in the first two slides, there is no need to include the third.
    - If disclosures of any direct financial or in-kind interest in a for-profit or not-forprofit entity <u>are declared</u> in the first two slides, the last slide needs to be filled.
